**RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE TOWNSHIP OF MANSFIELD TO ENTER INTO AN  
INTERLOCAL SERVICE AGREEMENT WITH THE TOWNSHIP OF BORDENTOWN

**WHEREAS,** the Township of Mansfield wishes to enter into an Interlocal Service Agreement with the Township of Bordentown for animal control services; and

**WHEREAS,** NJ-S.A. 40A:65-1, et seq., the Interlocal Service Act, permits this Interlocal Service Agreement;
